We now have a group of people who have volunteered to be interviewed for the project. These interviews will be accessible via the website and will contribute to our exhibition research. We are training volunteers to carry out the interviews and as we have bought our own equipment we hope that in the future we will be able to add to our initial interviews.

We had a fantastic training session with Michelle Winslow from the oral history society and we intend to put our training into action in the next couple of months. Research

There are still lots of areas that we need help to research. We are planning two small temporary exhibitions based on the themes of Escrick at work and Escrick at leisure and would love to hear from anyone that may be interested in carrying out some theme related research.
